DESCRIPTION of PROGRAMS

Emergency Medical Technician—Basic (EMT-B-I) Classroom Version

Course offers instruction in a classroom setting for national curriculum EMT-B-I course required for county and national registry certification. After successful completion of this course, students will be allowed to register and take the National Registry Emergency Medical Technician (NREMT) Exam.

Prerequisites: Students must be 18 years of age or older, have a high school diploma, GED or passage of the California high school proficiency and have a valid Basic Life Support (BLS CPR) card. At time of enrollment your high school diploma, GED or passage of the California high school proficiency exam will be required. BLS CPR card will be required prior to taking the final exam.

Classroom Training: Program fulfills 164 hours of required classroom training consisting of lectures, quizzes, and skills training. Evaluation of skills and final exam are within this time

period. To successfully complete this classroom training students must receive 80% or better on all quizzes and final exam.

Internship: Twenty-four hours of ambulance ride-along for skills evaluation. Students must have a minimum of ten (10) patient contacts and 24 clinical hours. Student must coordinate with instructors to set-up ride-along arrangements with one of Fire Future providers. Any student who turns in a falsified clinical hour form will be disqualified and fail the course **WITHOUT** refund and will not be eligible to enroll in future courses. Students must successfully complete both ride-along and classroom instructional training, pass all quizzes with 80% or better, before a course completion certificate is issued.

DEGREE PROGRAM

Fire Future does not have a degree program and is not accredited. Successful completion of our EMT Basic Course will allow student to take the National Registry Emergency Medical Technician (NREMT) Exam only. Students enrolled in an unaccredited institution such as Fire Future will not be eligible for federal financial aid programs. A degree program that is unaccredited or a degree from an unaccredited institution is not recognized for some employment positions, including but not limited to position with the State of California.

Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) -- Refresher

Course offers continuing education hours/credits in a classroom setting for national curriculum EMT-B course required for county and National Registry Emergency Medical Technician (NREMT) re-certification.

Prerequisite: Student must be 18 years of age or older at time of registration and have a valid EMT license. Proof of EMT license must be provided at time of enrollment.

Classroom Training: Includes classroom and skills training and final exam. Class days, hours, and lunch breaks are announced on first day of class. Student must receive 80% or better on the final exam to be considered eligible to earn the EMT-B-I course completion certificate, which is issued on the last day of class.

Psychomotor Exam Only

This exam fulfills all state and National Registry Emergency Medical Technician (NREMT) skills requirements. Exam will take approximately one hour to complete.

Prerequisites: Student must be 18 years of age or older at the time of registration and have a valid EMT license or letter to test from NREMT.

At time of enrollment, proof of EMT license or letter to test from NREMT must be provided.

Classroom Training: Psychomotor exams are held on the 1st and 3rd Saturday of every month and student must register with their instructor in advance to be placed in a psychomotor exam session. Students must successfully perform all items on skills sheet.

24 Hours of Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) Continuing Education

Course is a comprehensive and active review of the new Education Standards, providing both an overview of new information contained within the Education Standards at the EMT level and a source of continuing education. 24-hour course includes the following topics: preparatory—1-hour, airway—2 hours, patient assessment—3 hours, OB/infants/children—2 hours, trauma—4 hours, medical/behavioral—4 hours, elective—8 hours and elective—8 hours.

Prerequisites: Student must be 18 years of age or older at time of registration and have a valid EMT license. At time of enrollment, proof of EMT license must be provided.

Classroom Training: Includes classroom and skills training and final exam. Class days, hours, and lunch breaks are announced on first day of class. Student must receive 80% or better on the final exam before the EMT course certificate is issued.

48 Hours of Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) Continuing Education

Course is designed to be an active and comprehensive review of the new Education Standards, providing both an overview of new information contained within the Education Standards at the EMT level and a source of continuing education. 48-hour course includes the following topics: preparatory—3 hours, airway—8 hours, medical/behavioral—15 hours, trauma—11 hours, OB/infants/children—5 hours, and elective 6 hours.

Prerequisites: Student must be 18 years of age or older at time of registration and have a valid EMT license. At time of enrollment, proof of EMT license must be provided.

Classroom Training: Includes classroom and skills training and final exam. Class days, hours, and lunch breaks are announced on first day of class. Student must receive 80% or better on the final exam before course certificate is issued.

Basic Life Support CPR (BLS CPR)

Course is designed to certify students in basic life support CPR based on American Heart Association 2022 protocols.

Prerequisites: Student must be 18 years of age or old at time of registration.

Classroom Training: Four (4) hours which includes skills and classroom training and final exam. Student must receive 80% or better on written exam and pass skills testing.

TOTAL PROGRAM CHARGES

Emergency Medical Technician—Basic (EMT-B-I) Classroom Version: \$1050.00 for class. Course Binder and course equipment are included. Course eTextbook is needed for this class, it can be purchased as an eBook for \$74.99 with an additional option to print for a cost of \$46.61.

Basic Life Support CPR (BLS CPR) \$60.00 for class. No additional fees are required for this class. Course Fee includes a Digital Copy of CPR card.

Emergency Medical Technician—Refresher: \$150.00 for class.

No additional fees are required for this class.

Psychomotor Exam Only: \$75.00 for class. No additional fees are required for this class.

24 Hours of EMT Continuing Education: \$50.00 for class. Course materials are included.

No additional fees are required for this class.

48 House of EMT Continuing Education: \$75.00 for class. Course materials are included.

No additional fees are required for this class.

CANCELLATION, WITHDRAWAL and REFUND POLICY

Student's Right to Cancel: Student have the right to withdraw from any Fire Future Training Program. Cancellation and/or withdrawal notice must be in writing. Written notification is to be emailed to the contact email address: admin@firefuture.com

Cancellation/Withdrawal can be affected by the student's conduct, including, but not necessarily limited to, a student's lack of attendance, student's conduct or by written request. A student has the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later.

Refund Policy shall apply to above notification, classes listed below, in accordance to student's attendance, and pro-rated as depicted in each class category below.

The student's email request shall be reviewed and results (of refund approval or non-approval) will be communicated to the student within 30 days of receipt of notification.

If a refund is the final decision a check will be issued within 45 days of receipt of withdrawal or cancellation. If a student received federal student financial aid funds, the student will be entitled to a refund of monies not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.

ENROLLMENT REQUIREMENTS

Student must be at least 18 years of age or older at the time of registration for all courses. Student must provide proof of high school diploma, GED or passage of the California high school proficiency exam for Emergency Medical Technician –Basic (EMT-B) Classroom and Hybrid Online Version courses. Student must provide a copy Basic Life Support CPR card for Emergency Medical Technician –Basic (EMT-B-I) Classroom and Hybrid Online Version courses. Student must provide a copy of EMT License or letter to test from NREMT for Emergency Medical Technician –Refresher, Psychomotor Exam Only, 24 Hours of EMT Continuing Education, 48 Hours of EMT Continuing Education, and 72 Hours of EMT Continuing Education courses. Student must provide a copy of EMT or Paramedic License for Medical Unit Leader S-359 (MEDL) course.

Emergency Medical Technician—Basic (EMT-B-I) Classroom Version

\$250.00 non-fundable registration fee. Student who has completed 60% or less of the period of attendance will be issued a pro-rata refund as follows: Student who cancels within 30% of class (Class Days 6 will be refunded 75% of tuition less non-refundable registration fee. Student who cancels with 60% of class (Class Day 12) will be refunded 50% of tuition less non-refundable registration fee. Student who has completed more than 60% of class (after Class Day 13) will not receive a refund.

Emergency Medical Technician—Refresher

\$50.00 non-refundable registration fee. Student who has completed 60% or less of the period of attendance shall be issued a pro-rata refund as follows: Student who cancels after the first day of class will be refunded 75% of tuition, less non-refundable registration fee. Student who has completed more than 60% of class (after Class day 2) will not receive a refund.

Psychomotor Exam Only:

\$25.00 non-refundable registration fee. Student who has completed 60% or less of the period of attendance shall be issued a pro-rata refund. Student who attends first day of class will not receive a refund.

24 Hours of EMT Continuing Education

Student who has completed 60% or less of the period of attendance shall be issued a prorated refund as follows: Student who cancels after the first day of class will be refunded 75% of

tuition. Student who has completed more than 60% of class (after Class Day 2) will not receive a refund.

48 Hours of EMT Continuing Education

Student who has completed 60% or less of the period of attendance shall be issued a prorate refund as follows: Student who cancel with 30% of calls (Class Days 1-2) will be refunded 75% of tuition, student who cancels with 60% of class (Class Days 3-4) will be refunded 50% of tuition. Student who has attended and completed more than 60% of class (after Class Day 4) will not receive a refund.

STUDENT TUITION RECOVERY FUND (STRF)

“The State of California established the Student Tuition Recovery Fund (STRF) to relieve or mitigate economic loss suffered by a student in an educational program at a qualifying institution, who is or was a California resident while enrolled, or was enrolled in a residency program, if the student enrolled in the institution, prepaid tuition, and suffered an economic loss. Unless relieved of the obligation to do so, you must pay the state-imposed assessment for the STRF, or it must be paid on your behalf, if you are a student in an educational program, who is a California resident, or are enrolled in a residency program, and prepay all or part of your tuition. You are not eligible for protection from the STRF and you are not required to pay the STRF assessment, if you are not a California resident, or are not enrolled in a residency program.”

It is important that you keep copies of your enrollment agreement, financial aid documents, receipts, or any other information that documents the amount paid to the school. Questions regarding the STRF may be directed to the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education, 1747 North Market Blvd., Suite 225, Sacramento, California, 95834, (916) 574-8900 or (888) 370-7589.

To be eligible for STRF, you must be a California resident or are enrolled in a residency program, prepaid tuition, paid or deemed to have paid the STRF assessment, and suffered an economic loss as a result of any of the following:

1. The institution, a location of the institution, or an educational program offered by the institution was closed or discontinued, and you did not choose to participate in a teach-out plan approved by the Bureau or did not complete a chosen teach-out plan approved by the Bureau.
 2. You were enrolled at an institution or a location of the institution within the 120 day period before the closure of the institution or location of the institution, or were enrolled in an educational program within the 120 day period before the program was discontinued.
 3. You were enrolled at an institution or a location of the institution more than 120 days before the closure of the institution or location of the institution, in an educational program offered by the institution as to which the Bureau determined there was a significant decline in the quality or value of the program more than 120 days before closure.
 4. The institution has been ordered to pay a refund by the Bureau but has failed to do so.
 5. The institution has failed to pay or reimburse loan proceeds under a federal student loan program as required by law, or has failed to pay or reimburse proceeds received by the institution in excess of tuition and other costs.
 6. You have been awarded restitution, a refund, or other monetary award by an arbitrator or court, based on a violation of this chapter by an institution or representative of an institution, but have been unable to collect the award from the institution.
 7. You sought legal counsel that resulted in the cancellation of one or more of your student loans and have an invoice for services rendered and evidence of the cancellation of the student loan or loans.
- To qualify for STRF reimbursement, the application must be received within four (4) years from the date of the action or event that made the student eligible for recovery from STRF.

A student whose loan is revived by a loan holder or debt collector after a period of noncollection may, at any time, file a written application for recovery from STRF for the debt that would have otherwise been eligible for recovery. If it has been more than four (4) years since the action or event that made the student eligible, the student must have filed a written application for recovery within the original four (4) year period, unless the period has been extended by another act of law.

However, no claim can be paid to any student without a social security number or a taxpayer identification number.”

PROBATION & DISMISSAL POLICIES

Any Student found violating any of the following will be immediately removed from the course Without a refund:

1. Cheating on Any exam(s) and/or quiz, assessments
2. Inappropriate behavior (sexual harassment, violence, intoxication, drug use, etc.) in the classroom or during ride-along.
3. Turning in falsified clinical hours on the ride-along forms
4. Violation of attendance policies
5. Violation of academic policies

ATTENDANCE POLICY

In order to be successful, student should make every effort to physically (meaning face-to-face) attend each classroom session. The following is the Attendance Policy for each program:

Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)—Basic EMT-B-I Classroom Version:

Student may miss no more than 12 hours of classroom time. Student is required to notify instructor at least one-hour in advance prior to class start time. This notification **MUST** be via text **and** email. The student will be assigned “make-up” work to complete what was missed and it **MUST** be submitted to the instructor by the next class date. Attendance is mandatory on class dates that include skills testing, ride-along, and final exam. Failure to attend on those dates are grounds for immediate dismissal from course **WITHOUT** refund. Extended “Leaves of Absence” are not permitted.

Emergency Medical Technician—Refresher

Student **MUST** be present at ALL classroom times to complete this course. No absences are permitted.

Psychomotor Exam Only

Exam date must be scheduled between Instructor (or) Director and student. Rescheduling must be communicated to instructor via email at least 24 hours in advance.

24 Hours of EMT Continuing Education

Student **MUST** be present at ALL classroom times to complete this course. No absences are permitted.

48 Hours of EMT Continuing Education

Student **MUST** be present at ALL classroom times to complete this course. No absences are permitted.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE POLICY

Due to the structure of course material no leaves of absence are permitted.

NOTICE CONCERNING TRANSFERABILITY OF CREDITS AND CREDENTIALS EARNED AT OUR INSTITUTION

The transferability of credits you earn at Fire Future (FF) is at the complete discretion of the institution to which you may seek to transfer. Acceptance of the certificate you earn in our EMT Program is also at the complete discretion of the institution to which you may seek to transfer. If the certificate that you earn at this institution are not accepted at the institution to which you seek to transfer, you may be required to repeat some or all of your coursework at that institution. For this reason, the student should make certain that their attendance at the Fire Future institution will meet the student's educational goals. This may involve contacting the institution to which the student may seek to transfer to after attending Fire Future to determine if the earned certificate will transfer.

ACTICULATION OR TRANSFER AGREEMENT

Fire Future has not entered into an articulation or transfer agreement.

EXPERIENTIAL CREDIT

Fire Future offers a certificate program that does not participate in experiential credit such as a university and/or degree program. Fire Future does not grant credit for prior personal and/or professional experiential.

STUDENTS FROM OTHER COUNTRIES

RECORDS

Fire Future maintains a student records/file for each student that enrolls in their program, regardless of completion. These records/files are in a Cloud based application and as well as on two (2) hard drives, these records/files are maintained for five (5) years from the date of course completion. The records/files contain the following:

1. Copies of all documents signed by the student, including their contract(s) information.
2. Record of dates of enrollment and certification(s) earned. If applicable, withdrawal from the Fire Future institution, leaves of absence and any other data related to student's association with and Fire Future.
3. Proof of high school diploma, GED or passage of the California high school proficiency exam.
4. Documents pertaining to each course a student is enrolled in. If applicable, copy of student's BLS CPR card or equivalent, skills testing, forms, final exam(s), course average score sheet, signed ride-along forms, and issued certificate number and date mailed to student.
5. A documentation showing dates and the total amount of money received from (or on-behalf of the) student.

6. If applicable, documentation specifying the amount of a refund, the method of calculating the refund, the date, the refund was made, and the name and address of the person or entity to which the refund was sent.
7. Transcripts shall be kept indefinitely.

ENGLISH PROFICIENCY

Students must have the ability to read and write English at the level of a graduate of an American High school as demonstrated by the possession of a high school diploma, GED or passage of the California high school proficiency exam.

Fire Future does not provide English language services such as translator or ESL classes.

FINANCIAL AID

Fire Future does not participate in federal and/or state financial aid programs.

REQUIREMENTS FOR STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

All students must pass both a Final Written Exam and Skills exam.

Students must have a cumulative average of at least 80% on their coursework to be eligible to take the Course Final Written Exam. If a student has not attained the required cumulative average prior to the date of the Final Exam, the student will not be allowed to sit for the exam.

A minimum score of 80% is required on the Final Exam to be considered a passing score. If a student does not pass the Final Written exam on the first attempt, the student will be given ONE opportunity to retake the exam within two weeks after the first attempt.

LOANS

Fire Future does not offer any loans to pay for any educational programs.
